Lillie Florence Arnett, 95, of Texico, passed away at 9:35 p.m., Tuesday, September 26, 2023, in Mt. Vernon.

She was born August 28, 1928, in Jefferson County, Illinois, the twelfth of thirteen children, to Alva Jake and Bessie (Whitson) Beal. On July 20, 1946, in Mt. Vernon, in a ceremony officiated by Rev. M. L. Baker, she married Harry Edward Arnett, and he preceded her in death on October 1, 2005.
